



## **Packing List for Adventure Photography Workshop**

### General Outdoor Equipment

(camping will be car camping)

- Tent/Bivy Sack
- Warm Sleeping Bag (expect lows in the 10-30F range for the overnight)
- Sleeping pad

**\*if you would like to avoid bringing these, you may rental locally at Teton Mountaineering (go to [www.tetonmountaineering.com](http://www.tetonmountaineering.com) ) or call 800-850-3595**

- Cold/Wet weather clothing/gloves/hat (we'll spend one afternoon on a rafting float trip shooting kayaking/rafting, so may get a little wet on the river)
- Lightweight Activewear (for midday warmth)
- Hiking boots/Trail Shoes
- Headlamp
- Waterbottle
- First Aid Kit
- Prescription Drugs if necessary

**\*we will be serving a basic dinner and breakfast at the campsite, so you don't need any stoves, cookware, etc unless you prefer to provide your own food or have special dietary requirements**

### Climbing

*(guides will provide all equipment necessary for climbing shoots, only bring below equipment if you have items you are more familiar with and would prefer to use)*

- Harness
- Belay/Rappel Device
- Climbing Shoes
- Ascenders (if you have them)

\*Staff will provide ropes and protection (and will have harnesses and other equipment to loan), attendees will not need to be on ropes to take advantage of instruction and shooting opportunities

### Photography Equipment

- "All the photo equipment you normally shoot with"
- Laptop (Apple will have loaners if you do not have your own, but Apple laptops cannot leave classroom)
- External Hard Drive (only if you intend to use our loaner laptops, so you can leave with all of your images at the end of the week)
- Your normal selection of cameras and lenses (Nikon will have loaner bodies and lenses)
- Card Reader
- Memory Cards (Lexar will have loaner cards and readers)

# ADVENTURE WORKSHOP

- Photo day pack/bag
- Dry Bags (or garbage bags) for camera/equipment splash protection on the river (water levels are fairly low this time of year and rafts will avoid all major rapids, so there is little need for more than basic splash protection)
- Small Tripod/Monopod
- Portfolio (digital or print)

**\*Please also bring 10 of your best Adventure images in JPEG format on CD or USB JumpDrive to project before the group on the first day.**

**NOTE: The classroom will not have internet access, so if you wish to show images for portfolio reviews or other purposes, please have digital images on your laptop or on CD/DVD, as you won't be able to load webpages in the classroom.**
